Dr. Gloria Bonilla-Santiago

Dr. Gloria Bonilla-Santiago is a Board of Governors Distinguished Service Professor in the Graduate Department of Public Policy and Administration at Rutgers University–Camden, where she also directs the Community Leadership Center and serves as Board Chair of the LEAP Academy University Charter School. A visionary educator and social entrepreneur, she has over 25 years of experience leading innovative programs that unite government, business, non-profits, and philanthropy to advance education and community development. Dr. Santiago is an award-winning scholar, Fulbright Specialist, and nationally recognized expert in school leadership, diversity management, and organizational development. Her honors include the Cabrini Ivy Young Willis & Martha Willis Dale Award, the Power of Woman Award, and an Honorary Doctor of Humane Letters from Cabrini University.

Through her pioneering work with LEAP Academy, Dr. Santiago created a national model for urban education, serving over 2,000 students from infancy through college with a 100% graduation and college placement rate. Her “cradle-to-college” pipeline integrates innovation, STEAM education, and family engagement to empower underserved communities and break cycles of poverty. A prolific author and thought leader, she has written *The Miracle on Cooper Street*, *Breaking Ground and Barriers*, and *Organizing Puerto Rican Migrant Farmworkers*, and is a frequent commentator for major media outlets on education and public policy.

Tasha Smith from Camden New Jersey is an acclaimed actress, director, and producer whose dynamic career spans some of Hollywood's most celebrated films and television series. She first gained critical acclaim in HBO's Emmy-winning *The Corner* and later became a fan favorite as Angela in Tyler Perry's *Why Did I Get Married* films. Beyond her screen work, Smith continues to shape the next generation of talent through her Tasha Smith Actors Workshop (TSAW), where she mentors aspiring artists with honesty, passion, and purpose.
